

Monday morning, we all made our way home following a delightful weekend away full of wonderful fun and friendship. I am sure everyone will agree to that.




President Deb James and A62 Chairman, Dianne Allen. Dianne made her dress from repurposed wedding gowns and did amazing beading on the bodice.





Nice to hear from you; yes we are going to Manchester; Dag won 't attend the Convention but he' be there; and we are staying at Hotel MOXY.



RASPBERRY COCONUT TEACAKE Serves 8–10

INGREDIENTS

- 135g desiccated coconut
- 375ml milk
- 200g fresh or frozen raspberries
- 300g caster sugar
- 225g self-raising flour butter, to serve (optional)

METHOD

Preheat the oven to 180°C/160°C fan. Line the base of a 21cm × 11cm loaf tin with baking paper and butter and flour the sides. Place the coconut, milk, raspberries, sugar and flour in a bowl and mix with a whisk o r wooden spoon to form a smooth batter. (You could also do this in a freestanding mixer with a paddle.)

Pour or spoon the batter into the tin and bake on the centre shelf of the oven for 1½ hours or until a skewer inserted in the centre comes out clean. Remove from the oven and rest in the tin for 5 minutes, then turn out the cake onto a wire rack to cool completely. Cut into slices and serve plain or with butter. The cake will keep in an airtight container for up to 4 days.

IF YOU WOULD LIKE TO ICE THE CAKE, BLEND TOGETHER THE JUICE OF 5 SIEVED RASPBERRIES, 100G ICING SUGAR AND A TEASPOON OR SO OF BOILING WATER TO ACHIEVE A RUNNY CONSISTENCY. DRIZZLE OVER THE COOLED CAKE AND FINISH WITH A HANDFUL OF TOASTED COCONUT.
