

Quote: Annemieke Mein is a Dutch-born Australian textile artist who specialises in depicting wildlife. She was the first textile artist to be member of Wildlife Art Society of Australasia and the Australian Guild of Realist Artists. The subjects of her sculpted textiles range from birds, frogs and fish, through to insects such as moths, dragonflies, wasps and grasshoppers. Her fondness for insects and her highly detailed works, often greatly enlarged and showing normally invisible colours and textures, have revealed new aspects of the everyday natural world.

I think we all agreed what a fantastic display of work. Lunch was at The Criterion Hotel where we all enjoyed our choice of food. Following lunch, we went back to the exhibition for a short time and then about 3.30pm ish we got back into the cars to drive home.
